Detailed Itinerary

Saturday, 10 Oct 2009

Welcome to Johannesburg!

You will be met and transferred to Melrose Arch Hotel in Sandton.

Spend 1 night at Melrose Arch in a Standard Double on Bed & Breakfast basis

Take a walk across to **Moyo** nearby, a restaurant serving new African cuisine, later for a welcome dinner and to meet your fellow travellers.

The Melrose Arch Hotel is an exclusive offering in the secure Melrose Arch precinct, an urban development in Johannesburg. This secure complex contains restaurants, bars, business facilities and more in a secure and social setting, The hotel is the perfect base from which to explore the area without having to worry about your safety or having to take a taxi.

Accommodation consists of 118 rooms with warm natural tones and luxurious personal touches. They all come with well-appointed private bathrooms with luxury baths and scented candles as well as a separate shower. There is a DVD player (with a selection of 6 free DVDS) and Internet access, as well as air conditioning and a work desk to serve your business needs. Set in the Melrose Arch precinct, the hotel allows you to forget about the usual worries of crime and safety in Johannesburg. The area is policed and private plus there is 24-hour CCTV so you are safe and secure. You can explore all the restaurants, bars and entertainment options on foot. Sunday, 11 Oct 2009

Check out of Melrose Arch after breakfast and meet your transfer to Johannesburg Airport.

You will depart from Johannesburg at 10:10 on BP 212 with Air Botswana.

Your BP 212 flight arrives in Maun at 11:50 on 10 Oct 2009.

You will be met on arrival in Maun and transferred by Air (puddle jump) to Chief's Camp.

Spend 2 nights at Chief's Camp occupying a Double Suite on a Fully Inclusive with Local Beverages basis

Chief's Camp is a luxury bush lodge situated on Chief's Island in the exclusive Mombo Concession of the Moremi Game Reserve in Botswana. In this "predator capital of Africa", wild dog, lion, cheetah and leopard abound, and guests enjoy exceptional opportunities to interact with this amazing environment. Recently, white rhino have been introduced to this concession, making it the only place in Botswana where these magnificent animals can be seen in their natural habitat. Chief's Camp has been so skillfully integrated into the landscape that guests can often view game without even leaving camp. Shaded from the heat of the day by a beautiful grove of jackalberry trees, Chief's Camp is so remote you'll feel like the only humans for miles and miles. Twelve secluded, permanent luxury bush pavilions are designed for ultimate privacy and comfort, and to offer you a front row seat for this rich and rewarding African adventure. Each features an en suite bathroom and private game viewing deck. The main lodge complex houses the dining area, curio shop, library and reception area. There is an exquisite swimming pool and a range of spa treatments are offered by the resident beauty therapist in a poolside treatment sala from May to October each year.

Game viewing opportunities include daily excursions in open four-wheel-drive vehicles and quiet mokoro trips along narrow Delta channels during the flood season. Expert guides are always on hand to offer a wealth of wildlife knowledge, to help you make the most of these rare and wonderful opportunities. Moremi Game Reserve is located in the northeastern section of Okavango, it was named after Chief Moremi III who proclaimed 1,800 square km of pristine wilderness - ancient mopane forests, lagoons, islands,

seasonal floodplains and open grassland - as a game sanctuary. The Moremi is one of Africa's greatest parks, teeming with game and birds. There are no fences and the animals migrate freely. In the dry season a large proportion of Botswana's elephant migrate to this area. You can also see lions, cheetahs, leopards, hyenas, wild dogs, buffalo, hippos, dozens of different antelopes, zebras, giraffes, monkeys, baboons and more than 400 species of birds.



Your Out2Africa Safari in the Okavango Delta

The Okavango Delta in Northern Botswana is one of the world's largest inland water systems. Its headwaters start in Angola's western highlands, with numerous tributaries joining to form the Cubango river, which then flows through Namibia (called the Kavango) and finally enters Botswana, where it is then called the Okavango.

Millions of years ago the Okavango river used to flow into a large inland lake called Lake Makgadikgadi (now Makgadikgadi Pans). Tectonic activity and faulting interrupted the flow of the river causing it to backup and form what is now the Okavango delta. This has created a unique system of water ways that now supports a vast array of animal and plant life that would have otherwise been a dry Kalahari savanna.

The Delta's floods are fed from the Angolan rains, which start in October and finish sometime in April. The floods only cross the border between Botswana and Namibia in December and will only reach the bottom end of the delta (Maun) sometime in July,

Taking almost nine months from the source to the bottom. This slow meandering pace of the flood is due to the lack of drop in elevation, which drops a little more than 60 metres over a distance of 450 kilometres. The delta's water deadends in the Kalahari – , with over 95 per cent of the water eventually evaporating.

The delta environment has large numbers of animal populations that are otherwise rare, such as crocodile, red lechwe, sitatunga, elephant, wild dogs, buffalo, wattled crane as well as the other more common mammals and bird life.

Your Day of Arrival

Lunchtime We usually try to ensure that you arrive in time for afternoon tea and game drive. You will be met by the Camp Manager or Host who will welcome you to the camp. They will give you an orientation and explain the time table of the camp. It is very important to note that time tables vary from camp.

15h00 Afternoon Tea is served and it's usually a fine affair. A chance to be introduced to your guide. You will depart shortly afterwards on your afternoon activity. Depending on the camp you are staying at there are a wide variety of activities to choose from in the Okavango Delta.

Sunset As the sunsets your guide will find a position to stop your Boat Launch, your Mokoro or your Game Drive Vehicle and you will enjoy a cocktail and watch the Sunset over Botswana. This is what we traditionally call a Sundowner!



19h30 You will return to camp to freshen up for dinner. Dinner is usually served outside, be sure to wear bug spray!

After dinner you will be escorted back to your room by the security guards who patrol the camps. Many of the camps in the Okavango Delta are open which means that the Wildlife can walk through camp; the presence of the security guards keeps the camp safe.

Due to their remote location most of the camps in the Delta operate on Generators and once everyone has gone to bed some of these generators are turned off, your camp manager will explain this to you if this affects you and the camp you are staying at. The rooms often have 'back up' battery life lights and torches so you're not completely left in the dark!

The Following Morning

06h00 The early birds catches the fattest worm... and the best game viewing is to be found first thing in the morning!

06h30 Meet your ranger and tracker for early morning breakfast. Unlike camps in South Africa, the camps in the Okavango Delta usually serve a reasonably substantially breakfast before going on safari. This usually consists of Pastries, Cereals, Fruit and Yoghurts. We tend to find the camps wait to serve the hot breakfast until your return from safari.

10h00 From about 10h00 onwards the vehicles return from the game drives and you can enjoy a well earned brunch. The camps will serve hot breakfast as well as an assortment of salads, cold meats and desserts. No one ever complains of being hungry.

After an early start most guest retire to their rooms to relax or enjoy time around the Pool, or simply enjoy being in and around the camps

For guest who are departing you will be transferred back to the airstrip for your onward flight. One thing that frequently worries guest when flying in and around the Delta is that Flight Times and Departure Times never appear on our documentation. The reason for this is that the flight times are very much dependant on the number of guests traveling on that particular day, the weather conditions and the airplane used. The camp management will confirm transfer times to you the day before.

Activities in the Okavango Delta

Lodges in the Okavango Delta offer a variety of activity depending on two things: 1) Seasonality and 2) Location of the lodges . We do our best to advise you of which activities the specific lodges are offering at the time of year you visit. The Camp Managers and staff at the camp you are staying at will explain the day to day time at the specific camps. When planning your Botswana itinerary we do our best to try and help you select camps which will give you the full variety of Delta experiences. However we can not be held responsible, if for some reason (water levels or safety etc) the camps are not operating the activities at the time you plan to visit.

The Mokoro

Safari activities by water are the primary specialty of the Okavango - the mokoro - a dug out canoe which is 'poled' along by your Guide is the most evocative way of exploring the numerous waterways. You silently glide along the waterways, and can quietly see things the smaller things like kingfishers, waterlilies, colourful frogs and dragon flies. Its also from the Mokoros that you can see some of Africa's most spectacular Sunsets.



Motor Launches

A motor launch enables you to travel along the main waterways and lagoons of the Okavango Delta. In certain parts of the Okavango Delta it is possible to fish for Bream and African Tiger Fish.



Game Drives

Traditional 4x4 Game viewing vehicles are used on the main islands, with night drives available in the private concession areas. Please note that night game drives are not allowed within the National Park. Your travel consultant will advise you whether the lodge you are staying at is in on a private concession or in a National Park.



Walking Safaris

Walking Safaris are available from most Camps and Lodges - perhaps the most exciting way of viewing Game - stalking and tracking wildlife with an expert Guide. Please note that walking safaris are only permitted in private concessions. Here again your travel consultant will be able to explain to you whether the camp you are staying at offers walks or not.

Tuesday, 13 Oct 2009

Check out of Chief's Camp after a final game viewing activity and breakfast at leisure. Board your Air Transfer by scheduled charter to Kasane Airport in the Northernmost corner of Botswana.

You will be met and transferred to Chobe Chilwero nearby.

Spend 2 nights at Chobe Chilwero in a Double Suite on a Fully Inclusive with Local Beverages basis

Chobe Chilwero is located on a gentle hill overlooking the Chobe River and Sedudu Island in Northern Botswana. Midday Welcome to Chobe !

You will be met on your arrival at the lodge and given a brief camp orientation. You will be taken to your room and given a chance to relax and unwind before your afternoon and activities

13h00 Meal times vary from Camp to Camp, and upon orientation you will be given an exact time table. However lunch is usually served at about 13h00.

After lunch perhaps take the opportunity to relax and unwind and enjoy the facilities. Find the pool, enjoy a massage or simply enjoy the privacy that your room affords you.

15h00 It's Teatime! You will be introduced to your ranger at Teatime as well as meeting the other guests who will be joining you on your game activity.

There are two types of activities on offer at Chobe National Park. Game Viewing in the National Park on Vehicles and Boat Cruises on the Chobe River.

In consultation with your ranger we suggest you split your time and enjoy both of these activities.

Sunset Boat Cruises

Sunset Boat Cruises on the Chobe River are definitely something you will not want to miss. Chobe is well known for its large herds of elephant and buffalo that come down to the water edge to drink. From your boat you can observe a large variety of water birds including Fish Eagles, Kingfishers and Egrets. Of course the sunsets are spectacular and the sheer experience of watching the sun go down, with a gin and tonic in your hand, surrounded by a herd of elephants, is the kind of thing that memories are made of !



The Following Morning

05h00 Who said you were on holiday?

Wake up calls vary from camp to camp and from summer to winter. Your camp host will explain the times to you. These times are a good guideline. The best animals are to be found first thing in the morning before the heat of the day. There will be chance to siesta later in the day.

05h30 Meet your ranger and tracker for early morning tea and coffee before heading out on safari.

Morning Game Drives

Enjoy open game drive safaris in the Chobe National Park. This area is home to Leopard, Lion, Buffalo and Elephant as well as many species of plains games. Keep your eyes open for the rare Puku Antelope, a small antelope who is a resident of Chobe and parts of Zambia and the Congo! Bird lovers will marvel at the large amount of vultures and eagles.



Thursday, 15 Oct 2009

Check out of Chobe Chilwero after a final morning activity and breakfast at leisure. Meet your transfer across the border into Zambia and on to the Victoria Falls area.

Spend 2 nights at Royal Livingstone in a Standard King on Bed & Breakfast basis

There will be an opportunity to swim in the Devil's Pools on the edge of the Falls and lunch will be served under some trees on the island.

The walks are only operated at times of lower water, walks are also offered from within the Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park at the Eastern Cataract to Livingstone Island.



Saturday, 17 Oct 2009

Check out of Royal Livingstone after breakfast and meet your transfer to Livingstone Airport nearby.

You will depart from Livingstone at 10:30 on an Icon Expeditions flight.

Your Icon flight arrives in Skukuza at 13:40 on 17 Oct 2009.

You will be met on arrival and transferred to Singita Lebombo by Air.

Singita Lebombo is the crème de la crème of safari not only in Southern Africa but Africa as a whole. It is situated in a private concession in a Wilderness area of the Kruger National park.

Day of Arrival

11h00

You will be met by the camp manager who will spend time explain the times and procedures specific to the camp. You will be taken to your room to settle in.

- 13h00** Lunch is served on arrival – after lunch a chance to relax and unwind in your room.
- 15h00** Its Teatime ! You will be introduced to your ranger at Teatime as well as meeting the other guests who will be joining you on your game drive.
- 15h30** Safari Time . You will start your safari in the Kruger Park Area. The area is home to the Big Five as well as Cheetah and Wild Dogs. Your ranger will be driving the vehicle and it's the tracker up front looking out for tracks and spotting the animals.
- 18h00** As the sunsets the ranger will find a pretty spot in the bush to stop and enjoy Sundowner Cocktails. A real safari tradition



- 18h30** Its starting to get dark now and the tracker and guide use a powerful spot like to spot animals. The animals eyes reflect with the spot light. During the dark they will concentrate on the nocturnal animals such as Leopards and Lions

- 19h30** The timing of dinner is determined by the activities on safari ! If there are things happening and lions hunting – your dinner will wait. You return to the camp where you will be met by a security guard. They will escort you to your room.

A chance to freshen up before the security guard escorts you to dinner.

- 20h00** Dinner Time. There are a number of places to enjoy dinner at the lodge and weather dependant the camp manager will select the perfect venue. Your ranger usually joins you for dinner and the camp fire stories have been known to continue into the early hours !

After dinner you will be escorted to your room by the security guard !

The Following Morning

- 05h00** Wake Up ! Wake Up ! ... it's an early start. The best game viewing is to be found first thing in the morning !
- 05h30** Meet your ranger and tracker for early morning tea and coffee before heading out on safari.
- 09h30** From about 09h30 onwards the vehicles return from the game drives and you can enjoy a well earned breakfast !



- 11h00** Enjoy a walk with your tracker. Avoid the big animals and concentrate on the smaller things. The tracker will tell you fascinating stories of the bush as well as the traditional cultural and medicinal properties of trees and plants !

After your walk a chance to relax and unwind in the room – perhaps cool down in the plunge pool !

13h00

Lunch is served – should you want to have your lunch brought to the suite – please liaise with the camp manager. It might be nice to spend time in the room relaxing privately.

After which the day simply repeats itself !

Tuesday, 20 Oct 2009

Check out of Singita after a final morning game drive and breakfast at leisure. You will be transferred to Kruger Mpumalanga Airport by Air to check in for your SAA flight to Cape Town.

You will depart from Kruger Mpumalanga at 13:05 on SA 8664 with South African Airways.

Your SA 8664 flight arrives in Cape Town at 15:40 on 20 Oct 2009.

You will be met at Cape Town Airport on arrival and transferred to The Cape Grace in the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront area.

Full Day Cape Point Tour

More sights and attractions you will not see in a single day. Explore the beautiful Cape Peninsula with a guide who loves the region, knows his history; and won't get lost. This day trip follows the scenic drive around the peninsula, stopping at the major attractions and for a spot of lunch along the way. There's much to see and more to do so it's an early start at 8.30am, where you will meet your guide and set off on what promises to be a splendid day. Pass through the stunning Clifton and Camps Bay areas and head towards Hout Bay and an optional trip to Seal Island. The Chapman's Peak Drive is a spectacular scenic route that winds its way along the coast with Fynbos-covered mountains on one side and the azure Atlantic crashing into the other. Visit the beautiful Cape Point Nature Reserve – watch out for the cheeky baboons – and the dramatic Cape of Good Hope. The homeward-bound side of the peninsular goes via Boulders Beach and its fascinating penguin colony.

After exploring the historic navel village of Simon's Town we stop for lunch at a local restaurant; your route then winds through the gracious Constantia Valley and makes a final call at the world-renowned Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens.
